Solid Waste Authority awarded grant

“The Chester County Solid Waste Authority applied for and was awarded a grant from the PA Dept. of Environmental Protection (PA DEP) for the five Regional Southeastern Pennsylvania Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Collection events held in Chester County during 2010. The grant reimburses each participating municipality one half of their 2010 expenses. Enclosed with this letter is a check in the amount of your reimbursement. (In our case the amount was \$242.00, but you might not want to include the amount in your article). The Solid Waste Authority will also submit a similar grant request for those municipalities who participate in the five collection events held in 2011.

We sincerely appreciate your cooperation and support for this award winning program. You would be interested to know that since the program began, over 32,500 vehicles, often representing more than one household, have delivered almost 3.25 million pounds of hazardous material for safe disposal. Please keep in mind that five (5) collection events will be held this year. Any advertising of these events, especially through your newsletters, is important to the success of the program.”
